

WELCOME TO UNIVERSITY LUTHERAN CHURCH during this season of Pentecost when we celebrate the presence of Jesus' Spirit who calls and gathers us into community and sends us forth into the world as the presence of God's love, justice, and peace. In our worship service today, we will be guided by the theme of inclusivity and unity as witnessed in Jesus Christ, who lived and died and lived again to make possible the day of God's salvation.

WE WELCOME EVERYONE AT THE LORD'S TABLE to receive God's gift of forgiveness and the powerful freedom of a new life in Christ. Please come down the center aisle, proceed to the communion rail, and kinesis open space. Hold out your hand to receive the bread. Gluten-free wafers are available. Please indicate your desire for a wafer at the time you are offered the bread. You may drink either from an individual glass, which will be served first, or from the chalice. The individual glasses in the center of the tray contain grape juice (golden color). The outside glasses contain red wine. An acolyte will pass by to pick up your individual glass. In the spirit of continuous communion, please return to your seat via the side aisles after you have drunk from the glass or chalice. After everyone has been served at the communion rail, the ministers will serve anyone in the pew that is unable to come forward. Please indicate your desire in this regard to the pastor. Parents who desire that their children not receive communion may bring them forward for a blessing.

PLEASE INDICATE YOUR ATTENDANCE at worship today and your participation at Holy Communion by completing the enclosed Worship Registration form and placing it in the offering plate.

SERVICE OF CONFESSION & ABSOLUTION

Confession

P: Our gracious God has welcomed us into this sacred space and called us to freedom in Jesus Christ by the power of the Holy Spirit. Although we live under grace, we still are human and often use our freedom to turn away from God and become slaves of sin. Given this dynamic, we take this moment to confess our sins and seek God's forgiveness.

(Time for silent confession)

- P: Gracious and merciful God,
- All: We confess to you that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our entire being. We have not loved our neighbors as we have been loved by you. We have allowed our prejudice to exercise dominion within us so that we discriminate against those whom we dislike or even despise. As much as we talk about inclusivity, we tend to ignore or exclude others because we feel uncomfortable with them in our presence. Too often, we can identify how others are slaves to sin and avoid dealing with the sin in our own lives. Forgive us for our lack of trust in you and for our departure from your way of grace and truth.

Absolution

P: In response to your confession, God liberates you once again and sends you on your way to follow in the way of Jesus. Guided by the Spirit, your own desire and will has been renewed so that you will obey God's commandments by loving your neighbor, welcoming the stranger in your midst, and dining with those whom the world has labeled as outcasts and sinners.





First Lesson

Job 38:1-11 The Message

At the end of the book of Job, after Job and his companions have argued about the cause of the great suffering Job endures, God finally speaks. These verses begin that speech, which is a grand vision of creation, describing God's ordering of the cosmos and inviting Job to marvel at its beauty.

And now, finally, God answered Job from the eye of a violent storm. He said:

"Why do you confuse the issue? Why do you talk without knowing what you're talking about? Pull yourself together, Job!

Up on your feet! Stand tall!

I have some questions for you,

and I want some straight answers.

Where were you when I created the earth?

Tell me, since you know so much!

Who decided on its size? Certainly you'll know that!

Who came up with the blueprints and measurements?

How was its foundation poured,

and who set the cornerstone,

Second Lesson 2 Corinthians 6:35-41

Paul and his fellow workers experience great hardships and even rejection while carrying out their missionary work. Nevertheless, Paul continuously proclaims that God has not rejected us but is graciously working for our salvation.

As we work together with him, we urge you also not to accept the grace of God in vain. For he says,

"At an acceptable time I have listened to you, and on a day of salvation I have helped you."

See, now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of salvation! We are putting no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, but as servants of God we have commended ourselves in every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships,

calamities, beatings, imprisonments, riots, labors, sleepless nights, hunger; by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, holiness of spirit, genuine love, truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; in honor and dishonor, in ill repute and good repute. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; as unknown, and yet are well known; as dying, and see—we are alive; as punished, and yet not killed; as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing everything.



Jesus' calming of the storm on the sea reveals his power over evil, since the sea represents evil and chaos. The boat on the sea is a symbol of the church and invites us to trust God amid life's turbulence.

When evening had come, Jesus said to the disciples, "Let us go across to the other side." And leaving the crowd behind, they took him with them in the boat, just as he was. Other boats were with him. A great windstorm arose, and the waves beat into the boat, so that the boat was already being swamped. But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion; and they woke him up and said to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" He woke up and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Peace! Be still!" Then the wind ceased, and there was a dead calm. He said to them, "Why are you afraid? Have you still no

faith?" And they were filled with great awe and said to one another, "Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?"
